Workplace Mental Health



The Florida Alliance is a member of the Integrated Benefits Institute (IBI). IBI recently shared a research article examining changes in employee mental health through a re-imagined workplace program. [Lyra Health | A Smarter Approach to Emotional Health](#), a workplace mental health organization focused on measurement-based care (MBC) and evidence supported treatments (EST), partnered in this effort. The workplace modified its offering of traditional EAPs (average of 3 to 5 sessions) into a more robust counseling offering where participants participated in an average of 25 counseling sessions. In addition, clinicians who participated in this study were selected for their use of ESTs and knowledge of MBC.

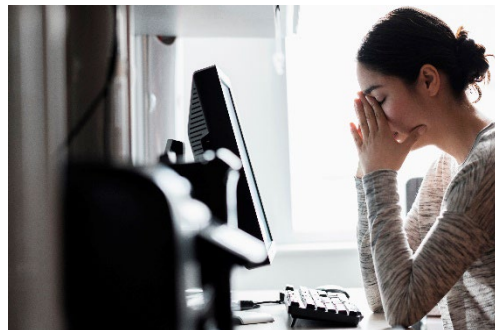
The study approach and design aligns with our upcoming Mental Health/Substance Use ELC launching later this month. Measurement-Based Care is one of the key tenets of The Path Forward for Mental Health and Substance Use that we will discuss during the ELC.

Results from the study showed positive changes in absenteeism (missing work), presenteeism (going to work sick) as well as statistically significant improvements in anxiety and depression symptoms based on their scores from several evidence supported measures. Learn more about the study here:

A New Tool to Find High-Quality Addiction Treatment Launched in Florida

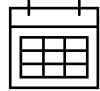
At the request of Florida Blue and Shatterproof, Karen van Caulil participated on the advisory council that assisted in the development and deployment of a new tool that launched in June to help Floridians seek high-quality and appropriate addiction treatment. ATLAS®, an Addiction Treatment Locator, Assessment, and Standards Platform, www.TreatmentATLAS.org, evaluates addiction treatment facilities' use of evidence-based best practices, includes an assessment to understand the appropriate level of care, and offers an easy-to-use dashboard to allow those in need and their loved ones to search for and compare facilities using criteria such as location, services offered, and insurance accepted so they can find the best treatment for their unique needs.



ATLAS also gathers and displays anonymous feedback from clients on their experiences at facilities. Just as we use consumer reviews to select goods and services in other areas of healthcare, this feedback helps to inform others' care decisions.

We will discuss ATLAS further during our Mental Health/Substance Use ELC scheduled to kick off at the end of August.

Leapfrog’s Annual Meeting – December 6, 2022, Washington, DC

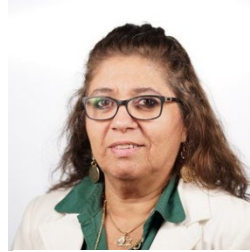
