FACTS FOR PARENTS TO STAY INFORMED:

- 1 HPV IS A COMMON VIRUS.
 - HPV, or human papillomavirus, often has no signs or symptoms. People can have the virus, pass it along, and not even know it.
- FOR MOST PEOPLE, HPV CLEARS ON ITS OWN.

 But for others who don't clear the virus, it can cause certain cancers later in life.
- 3 HPV CAN AFFECT BOTH MALES AND FEMALES.

 You probably know HPV can affect females, but males may also be at risk for certain HPV-related cancers later in life.
- 4 TENS OF THOUSANDS OF PEOPLE WERE DIAGNOSED WITH CERTAIN HPV-RELATED CANCERS*
