

Webinar Recording Available – Implications for Employers of Supreme Court Decision Ending Chevron Doctrine

On June 28, the Supreme Court issued a landmark decision in two interlinked cases that <u>overturn a 40-year precedent</u>, **significantly weakening the regulatory power of federal officials.** Understanding recent Supreme court decisions is essential for those involved in healthcare purchasing and policy.



For employer/healthcare purchasers, these changes could lead to increased volatility in the regulatory environment, impacting everything from Medicare reimbursement rates to FDA reviews of new medical technologies. Agencies might issue more conservative regulations to avoid legal pitfalls, potentially slowing innovation and adaptability in healthcare policies.

Additionally, businesses and plaintiffs now have a better chance of prevailing in lawsuits against federal regulations, which could undermine the stability of programs like Medicare and Medicaid that many employer-sponsored health plans rely on. This evolving judicial landscape requires us to stay vigilant and proactive in advocating for policies that ensure stability, equity,

and value in the healthcare system for all employers and their employees.

Noted healthcare legal and policy expert and frequent speaker at Florida Alliance events, Chris Deacon, JD, provided a detailed analysis of the Supreme Court decision and its likely impact on self-insured employers during this National Alliance webinar that took place on July 10.

Excellence in Diagnosis: Recommended Practices for Hospitals (July 2024 Update)

Along with researchers at The Johns Hopkins University, The Leapfrog Group conducted a small study and found that hospitals were aware of the problem of diagnostic errors, but unsure where to start to solve it. In response, Leapfrog published <u>Recognizing Excellence in Diagnosis: Recommended Practices for Hospitals</u>, a compilation of 29 evidence-based practices for hospitals to get started in tackling diagnostic errors.

The July 2024 report updated the 2022 recommendations on diagnostic practices by incorporating



recent advances in quality measurement, field-testing practices, and feedback from hospitals. It presents 22 recommended practices or diagnostic excellence, along with new resources and strategies for improving diagnosis safety and quality.

Wells Fargo Sued Over Employee Prescription Drug Costs (article, Market Screener)

Pharmacy Benefit Managers (PBMs) are facing increased government scrutiny over their role in escalating costs of prescription drugs. This week another class action lawsuit was filed, this time **against**



Wells Fargo & Co., accusing them of "mismanaging its employee health insurance plan and forcing tens of thousands of U.S. employees to overpay for prescription drugs." Specifically, former employees accuse Wells Fargo's health plan of paying inflated prices to PBMs. This is just the latest lawsuit to accuse employer-sponsored health plans of failing to negotiate lower prices for drugs on behalf of participants, as prescription drug costs continue to rise in the US.


- Hispanic Americans are <u>1.2 times</u> as likely to be obese than non-Hispanic whites
