COVID-19 is caused by a type of coronavirus (SARS-CoV-2).1



Flu is caused by an influenza virus 1

To help protect against COVID-19 and Flu, different vaccinations are required for each.1

COVID-19 and **Flu** may have **similar symptoms**.¹
